

Looking Ahead

The PSJRA continues to focus on securing grant dollars to supplement existing programs and fund future projects. Infrastructure grants to benefit both the expanded and the original Redevelopment Areas are being identified and submitted.

- 1. US-98 landscaping is nearly complete, and the PSJRA has requested funding to finish the landscaping between Avenue A and Avenue D.
- 2. The PSJRA expects to receive funding for the 4th Street open air kiosk project FY 2016 and begin construction by late Spring early summer.
- 3. George Core and Maddox Park will remain priorities as we strive to connect downtown to the Waterfront.
